The Vietnamese-German University (VGU) is a Vietnamese state university. The foundation of VGU in 2008 was based on a close cooperation between the Federal Republic of Germany and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam. Being a joint effort of Vietnamese and German higher education institutions, VGU follows German based faculty recruitment practices. These practices ensure that the evaluation and selection follow a merit-based, transparent and fair procedure.

This information pack provides you with an overview of the faculty recruitment procedure, working conditions, employment benefits and other related matters, e.g. working visa, accommodation, and transportation in Vietnam.

1. About VGU

A New Campus for VGU

The new campus of the Vietnamese-German University (VGU) is planned to be Vietnam's most modern campus in terms of design, but also in terms of its facilities that will create an ideal learning and working environment for students, lecturers and staff alike. Covering a total area of 50 hectares, the new campus will be located 40km from Ho Chi Minh City, in the new urban area of My Phuoc, Thoi Hoa Commune, Ben Cat District in Binh Duong Province.

The construction of the campus is divided into two phases. In Phase 1, the campus will be established for a maximum capacity of 5,000 students and prepared for its planned relocation in 2022.

In Phase 2, the campus will be completed to serve its maximum capacity of 12,000 students.

2. Why work at VGU?

Our Mission

Vietnamese-German University (VGU) is a public Vietnamese university developed in close partnership with Germany, which is based on the principles of academic freedom, unity of teaching and research and institutional autonomy. VGU is committed to excellence in research and teaching in the fields of smart engineering, information technology as well as business and economics relevant for both local and global sustainable development. Our graduates are trained to combine rigorous theoretical knowledge with critical thinking skills to creatively solve problems and ultimately are well prepared to assume leadership in the next generation of scientists, engineers and managers. As an acknowledged research university with a distinctive profile, VGU is a driver for the economic, social and environmental development of Vietnam.

Our Vision

Vietnamese-German University (VGU) aims to become a leading research university in Asia and the first choice for students and academics in the fields of smart engineering, information technology, business and economics in Vietnam by 2030. In close collaboration with universities worldwide, VGU will contribute to the advancement of science and technology. 3. Faculty recruitment process



Application screening

All applicants are subject to initial review for pre-selection by the Selection and Nomination Committee (SNC). Applications, which meet all of the basic eligibility criteria and the job requirements might be contacted by the Lecturer Recruitment and Development Officer (LRDO) for further clarification, especially with respects to their motivation for joining VGU. This step is followed by Assessment Sessions and Interviews.

Assessment sessions and interviews

Pre-selected applicants are invited to a *Preliminary interview* with VGU's President before participating in an *Assessment session* and *interview* to demonstrate his/her knowledge, skills and competencies to the SNC. The SNC often involves seven members: Faculty Dean, one Academic Director, one Academic Coordinator, one Professor from a partner university of VGU, one Lecturer of VGU, one Industry Representative, and one Student Representative from the relevant study programme.

The Assessment session is comprised of 3 parts, namely (1) a 30-minute trial lecture, (2) a 30-minute presentation on his/her research(s) and (3) a 20-minute presentation on his/her teaching concepts and research strategies.

In the interview, the candidate and the SNC can discuss open questions.

<u>Please note</u> that the trial lecture and presentations will be carefully evaluated. In terms of lecturing, the evaluation criteria include, for example, structure, clarity, presentation skills, and quality of content, use of media, performance, interaction with students, time management etc.



With respect to research, candidates are expected to demonstrate their research expertise (in part 2) and plans of their research program upon joining VGU (in part 3).

Job offer

A successful candidate, who is nominated by the SNC, will receive a job offer letter from VGU.

4. Working conditions

Work permit

By law, a non-Vietnamese citizen must hold a work visa/permit to legally work in Vietnam. VGU supports selected candidates with visa and work permit application process.

The academic year

The academic year at VGU is divided into two semesters, i.e. winter semester and summer semester. The winter semester starts on the first Monday after Sept. 15, marking the beginning of an academic year. The summer semester officially starts on the second Monday after the first day of Vietnamese traditional new year, TET, but not before week 7 of the respective calendar year.

Office hours and working hours

VGU follows the standard 40-hour work week or 8-hour work-day from Monday to Friday. Work hours at VGU are from 8:00 to 16:30, incl. a 30-minute lunch break.

At VGU, a lecturer teaches maximum 8 *academic hours* per week. The remaining hours of a 40-hour work week are dedicated for research, student advising, teaching related tasks, as well as related administrative responsibilities.

During university sessions, full-time faculty are required to be present at least 3 to 4 days per work week for teaching and teaching related tasks, student advising, or collaborative research, and other responsibilities.

Faculty evaluation

In order to timely recognise outstanding performance in research and teaching, a faculty evaluation is carried out annually at VGU. The criteria for evaluation of faculty focus on teaching and research activities. Student evaluation of teaching and program also affects the final evaluation results. A promotion to an academic management position is granted only in recognition of merit and competence and must be approved by the President of VGU.

Tenured appointment



After the initial two-year contract and pending performance evaluation, a full-time faculty can be granted tenure at VGU.

5. University facilities

Campus

The VGU interim campus with well-equipped classrooms and state-of-the-art laboratories provides excellent conditions for learning, teaching, and research. All classrooms are equipped with projectors and screens, and built-in access to video conferencing facilities. Additionally, VGU's learning facility in Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC) makes it convenient for master students, who live and work in the city, to follow courses in their part-time study programmes. VGU expects to move to the new campus by 2022.

Laboratories

VGU's laboratories are among the leading ones, readily available for learning and research activities at all areas of interest of both academics and students.

VGU's shuttle buses carry staff and students from HCMC to VGU and back every working day.

6. Research and networking support

Being a research-oriented university, VGU creates a supportive working environment for academics to pursue their research interests in any fields and to strengthen their research competences and networking.



At VGU, three key research groups have been established, i.e.: Manufacturing Technology and Sustainable Manufacturing, Sustainable Development and Transportation as well as Information Technology and Computer Science.

VGU faculty members also have the opportunities to expand research contacts through the network of VGU's consortium which includes 36 German universities. Additionally, VGU's relations with industrial partners and German agencies facilitate funding opportunities for research and joint-research projects.

The VGU Research Fund (VGU-RF) is dedicated to encouraging research initiatives and scientific researches for all academics and students. The VGU-RF finances VGU-level projects, with a funding budget for each project varying from less than VND 50,000,000 to maximum VND 350,000,000, depending on the scope, objective and anticipated output of each project/activity. Access to the National Foundation for Science and Technology Development (NAFOSTED) funded projects is made available to faculty members, as well as access to projects funded by the Ministry of Education and Training (MoET). The funding for these national-level projects may range between VND 500,000,000 to VND 1,000,000,000. In addition, the Department of Sciences and Technology also funds provincial-level projects with a budget from VND 1,000,000,000. VGU's Research Management Department provides administrative support for Principle Investigators (PI) to go through the project application and implementation process. Based on the request proposal and the submitted proofs, VGU will partially or fully offer financial support for attending conferences/workshops. The number of conferences/workshops are financially supported by VGU for respective academic staff per year as follows:



- (1) Prof, Assoc. Prof., senior lecturer: total fund is no more than VND 40,000,000/year.
- (2) lecturer: total fund is no more than VND 35,000,000/year.

VGU has established doctoral training programs in the field of engineering since 2018. So the lecturers have an opportunity to be Ph.D. supervisors.

7. Employment benefits

Remuneration

Fresh PhD holders with less than 2 years of teaching experience can expect a salary starting from E13 III.

Candidates with proven outstanding research and teaching records through two external evaluations may expect a salary starting from P1.

Performance at the assessment session is a factor to define the final pay group that the candidate is entitled to.

Please note that in Vietnam the awarding of Professor or Associated Professor title requires an approval by the State Professorship Committee. At the moment of the information pack, VGU does not have the authority to reward Professor and Associated Professor titles.

13th month salary



All VGU full-time faculty receive a 13th month salary, which is paid at the end of a calendar year. If an employee has worked for less than twelve months in a calendar year, payment of the 13th month salary will be calculated on a pro-rata basis.

All salary payments are made in Vietnamese currency, i.e. Vietnam Dong (VND).

Leave and holidays

In accordance with the Vietnam Labour Law, faculty at VGU observe 10 public holidays. In addition, VGU offers 12 days' annual leave and three days' sick leave per annum. Sick leave lasting more than a three-day period requires a verification by a physician and/or health care service provider.

Maternity leave, family medical leave and other leave forms are granted to employees in accordance with the Vietnam Labour law.

Professional development

At VGU, faculty can find learning and training opportunities to further develop their skills and competencies. There are several courses on teaching and learning strategy, student assessment, program design and quality assurance for teaching and learning provided by internal or external experts.

The following specific courses have been offered so far:

- Teaching for Quality Learning
- Developing, managing and assessing intended learning outcomes of degree program
- Development of a Teaching and Learning Philosophy
- Principles of Good Scientific Practice
- Development of a Research Strategy
- Developing and Operating Internal Quality Assurance System at universities
- Introduction into Institutional Accreditation
- Training accreditors for accreditation of higher education
- Quality Assurance at VGU How to establish a Systemic Approach to Quality Management.

Other activities are organized to develop professional and teaching skills for teaching staff at VGU such as conferences, workshops, seminars, training on subject matters, individual or collaborative research on a topic of professional interest and technology transfer. These academic events are the most important tools to update teaching staff's knowledge of subjects in light of



recent advances in the area and to exchange information and expertise among teaching staff, academics and industrialists.

8. Insurance

VGU offers health insurance to all employees. The current insurance carrier (in 2021) is PVI Insurance. VGU staff is also entitled to a basic annual health check-up paid by VGU. In accordance to Vietnam Labour Law, all Vietnamese employees at VGU are entitled to unemployment insurance.

9. Life in Vietnam

Living costs

The overall costs of living in Vietnam are relatively lower than those in developed countries. Therefore, it is easy to enjoy high living standards while still saving money.

Food and Drinks

Vietnamese local food is well-known for its delicious taste, nutrition, and reasonable price (\$1-\$6 for a meal). A wide variety of international cuisines is also offered in numerous restaurants, especially in large cities. Besides, the popularity of Buddhism makes it possible to find vegetarian dishes in any region.

Some top Vietnamese dishes according to the CNN include: phở, chả cá, bánh xèo, cao lầu, rau muống, nem rán/chả giò, gỏi cuốn and bún bò huế.

Culture



A mixture of Eastern and Western cultures can be experienced throughout Vietnam. Modern cinemas, opera houses, art galleries, and a growing live music scene are popular entertainment options.

Language

English is the official language at VGU. In the centre of Ho Chi Minh City, many locals can communicate in English and/or other foreign languages. Vietnamese courses are offered free of charge for employees at VGU.

Transportation

There are several means of transportation in Vietnam. Common choices for daily commutation are motorcycles, cars, taxis, and buses. Planes, boats, and trains are also cheap methods to travel around the country.
