The foundation of VGU in 2008 was based on a close cooperation between the Federal Republic of Germany and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam. Being a joint effort of Vietnamese and German higher education institutions, VGU follows German based faculty recruitment practices. These practices ensure that the evaluation and selection follow a merit-based, transparent and fair procedure.

This information pack provides you with an overview of the faculty recruitment procedure, working conditions, employment benefits and other related matters, e.g. working visa, accommodation, and transportation in Vietnam.

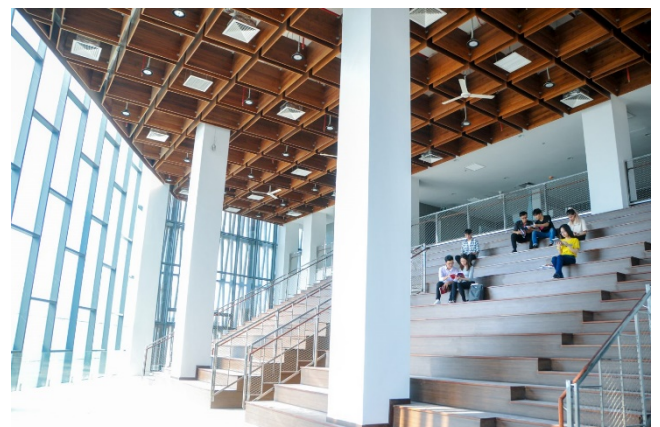

1. About VGU

VGU Campus

On 11/11/22, the VGU inaugurated its brand-new facilities, located in the new urban area of My Phuoc, Thoi Hoa Commune, Ben Cat District in Binh Duong Province (40 km North of Ho Chi Minh City). Covering a total area of 50 hectares, the campus is equipped with a sports centre, students' dormitories, an exhibition building, a lecturer village, an auditorium, a library, lecture halls, technical labs and offices for academics and administrative staff.

2. Why work at VGU?

Our Mission

Vietnamese-German University (VGU) is a public Vietnamese university developed in close partnership with Germany, which is based on the principles of academic freedom, unity of teaching and research and institutional autonomy. VGU is committed to excellence in research and teaching in the fields of smart engineering, information technology as well as business and economics relevant for both local and global sustainable development. Our graduates are trained to combine rigorous theoretical knowledge with critical thinking skills to creatively solve problems and ultimately are well prepared to assume leadership in the next generation of scientists, engineers and managers. As an acknowledged research university with a distinctive profile, VGU is a driver for the economic, social and environmental development of Vietnam.

3. Faculty recruitment process



Application screening

All applicants are subject to initial review for pre-selection by the Selection and Nomination Committee (SNC). Applications, which meet all of the basic eligibility criteria and the job requirements might be contacted by the Lecturer Recruitment and Development Officer (LRDO) for further clarification, especially with respect to their motivation for joining VGU. This step is followed by Assessment sessions and Interviews.

Assessment sessions and interviews

Pre-selected applicants are invited to a *Preliminary interview* with VGU's President before participating in an *Assessment sessions* and *Interviews* to demonstrate his/her knowledge, skills and competencies to the SNC. The SNC involves seven members: the Faculty Dean, the Academic Director, the Academic Coordinator, one Professor from a partner university of VGU, one Lecturer of VGU, one Industry Representative, and one Student Representative from the relevant study programme.

The Assessment sessions consists of three parts, namely (1) a trial lecture of a given topic, (2) a research presentation of chosen topics and (3) a presentation on his/her teaching concepts and research strategies. In the interview, the candidate and the SNC can discuss open questions.

Please note that the trial lecture and presentations will be carefully evaluated. In terms of lecturing, the evaluation criteria include, for example, structure, clarity, presentation skills, quality of content, interaction with students, time management, etc. With respect to research, candidates are expected to demonstrate their research expertise (in part 2) and plans of their research programme upon joining VGU (in part 3).

Job offer

A successful candidate, who is appointed by the SNC and approved by the Faculty Council and Academic Senate, will receive a job offer letter from VGU.

4. Working conditions

Work permit

By law, a non-Vietnamese citizen must hold a work visa/permit to legally work in Vietnam. VGU supports selected candidates with the visa and work permit application process.

The academic year

The academic year at VGU is divided into two semesters, i.e. winter semester and summer semester. The winter semester starts on the first Monday after Sept. 15, marking the beginning of an academic year. The summer semester officially starts on the second Monday after the first day of Vietnamese traditional new year, TET, but not before week 7 of the respective calendar year.

Office hours and working hours

VGU follows the standard 40-hour work week or eight-hour work-day from Monday to Friday. At VGU, a lecturer teaches a maximum of eight *academic hours* per week. The remaining hours of the 40-hour work week are dedicated for research, transferring and administrative responsibilities.

During university sessions, full-time faculty are required to be present at least three to four days per work week for teaching and teaching related tasks, student advising, collaborative research activities, and other responsibilities (such as participation in academic self-governance).

Faculty evaluation

In order to timely recognise outstanding performance in research and teaching, a faculty evaluation is carried out annually at VGU. The criteria for evaluation of faculty focus on teaching and research activities. Student evaluation of teaching and program organisation also affects the final evaluation results. A promotion to an academic management position is granted only in recognition of merit and competence and must be approved by the President of VGU.

Tenured appointment

After the initial two-year contract and pending performance evaluation, a full-time faculty can be granted tenure at VGU.

5. University facilities

Campus

The VGU campus with well-equipped classrooms and state-of-the-art laboratories provides excellent conditions for research, teaching and learning. All classrooms are equipped with projectors and screens as well as built-in access to video conferencing facilities. Additionally, VGU's learning facility in Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC) makes it convenient for master students, who live and work in the city, to follow courses in their part-time study programmes.

Laboratories

VGU's laboratories are among the leading ones in Vietnam, readily available for research and learning activities at all areas of interest of both academics and students.

Bus service

VGU's shuttle buses carry staff and students from HCMC to VGU and back every working day.

6. Research and networking support

Being a research-oriented university, VGU creates a supportive working environment for academics to pursue their research interests in any fields and to strengthen their research competences and networking activities.

As an academic staff at the VGU, you will receive the following support:

- A one-time funding of up to 40 million dong to participate in workshops/conferences.

- A mentoring program for young researchers with the consultation and advice from senior, experienced faculties in both teaching and research.
- Financial support of research activities, such as institutional research project grant, allowances for international/domestic working trips or conference/workshop participation, publication support as well as allowances for supervising students' projects.

VGU faculty members also have the opportunities to expand their research networks via the network of VGU's consortium which includes 40 German universities. Additionally, VGU's relations with industrial partners and German agencies facilitate funding opportunities for research and joint research projects.

The Research Management Department (RMD) is pivotal in supporting the academic staff at VGU in various aspects of research administration. The RMD focuses on streamlining procedures and frameworks, allowing academic staff to concentrate more on the substantive aspects of their research. RMD also actively assists academic staff by introducing research calls, searching for collaboration opportunities, and facilitating connections with industry and other institutions. RMD monitors project milestones and organizes related events and activities. Furthermore, they provide consultations to improve research proposals and applications, increasing the likelihood of securing funding.

VGU provides doctoral programs in *Computational Engineering (COM)*, *Computer Science (CSE)*, *Sustainable Urban Development (SUD)*, and *Sustainable Production Engineering (SPE)*. Therefore, lecturers active in these academic fields have an opportunity to be PhD supervisors. Every year, there are dozens of seminars, workshops, and conferences which take place at the VGU. For international conferences, VGU in general and the RMD in particular always support and create the best conditions for students to have the chance to attend and present his/her research at these conferences.

7. Employment benefits

Remuneration

Fresh PhD holders with less than two years of teaching experience can expect a salary starting from E13 III (see table 2).

Candidates with proven outstanding research and teaching records through two external evaluations may expect a salary starting from P1 (see table 2).

Performance at the assessment sessions is a key factor to define the lecturer level - junior lecturer, lecturer, senior lecturer - which influences the candidate’s pay group.

Please note that in Vietnam the awarding of a Professor or Associated Professor title requires an approval by the State Professorship Committee. At the moment of the information pack, VGU does not have the authority to reward Associated Professor and Professor titles.

13th month salary

All VGU full-time faculty receive a 13th month salary, which is paid at the end of a calendar year. If an employee has worked for less than twelve months in a calendar year, payment of the 13th month salary will be calculated on a pro-rata basis.

All salary payments are made in Vietnamese currency, i.e. Vietnam Dong (VND).

Leave and holidays

In accordance with the Vietnam Labour Law, faculty at VGU observe ten public holidays. VGU offers twelve days annual leave and three days sick leave per annum. Sick leave lasting more than a three-day period requires a verification by a physician and/or health care service provider. Maternity leave, family medical leave and other leave forms are granted to employees in accordance with the Vietnam Labour law.

Professional development

At VGU, faculty can find opportunities to further develop their skills and competencies. The following lists a selection of specific courses on teaching and research that have been offered at VGU so far:

- Development of a Teaching and Learning Philosophy
- Principles of Good Scientific Practice

Other activities are organized to develop professional skills for academic staff at VGU such as conferences, workshops, seminars, training on subject matters, individual or collaborative research on a topic of professional interest and technology transfer. These academic events are the most important tools to update staff's knowledge of subjects in light of recent advances in the area and to exchange information and expertise among academic staff and industrialists.

8. Insurance

VGU offers health insurance to all employees. The current insurance carrier is PVI Insurance. VGU staff are also entitled to a basic annual health check-up paid by VGU.

In accordance with Vietnam Labour Law, all Vietnamese employees at VGU are entitled to unemployment insurance.

9. Life in Vietnam

Living costs

The overall costs of living in Vietnam are relatively lower than those in developed countries. Therefore, it is easy to enjoy high living standards while still saving money.

Food and Drinks

Vietnamese local food is well-known for its delicious taste, nutrition, and reasonable price (\$1-\$6 for a meal). A wide variety of international cuisines are also offered in numerous restaurants, especially in large cities, such as Ho Chi Minh City. Besides, the popularity of Buddhism makes it possible to find vegetarian dishes in any region.

Some top Vietnamese dishes according to the CNN include: phở, chả cá, bánh xèo, cao lầu, rau muống, nem rán/chả giò, gỏi cuốn and bún bò Huế.

Culture

A mixture of Eastern and Western cultures can be experienced throughout Vietnam. Modern cinemas, opera houses, art galleries, and a growing live music scene are popular entertainment options.

Language

English is the official language at VGU. In the centre of Ho Chi Minh City, many locals can communicate in English and/or other languages. Vietnamese courses are offered free of charge for employees at VGU.

Transportation

There are several means of transportation in Vietnam. Common choices for daily commutation are motorcycles, cars, taxis, and buses. Planes, boats, and trains are also cheap methods to travel around the country.

VGU's daily shuttle buses pick up employees at Hồ Con Rùa (Turtle Lake) and along the way to campus, and return them home in the afternoon.

Accommodation

Accommodation options such as houses and apartments at affordable prices are plenty in both Hồ Chí Minh City and Bình Dương province.

Healthcare services

While public hospitals are still over-crowded, private healthcare establishments are of high standard. Private health insurance, therefore, is recommended for a healthy life in Vietnam. For expats, the best private hospitals in Hồ Chí Minh City include the Franco-Vietnamese (FV) Hospital, FV Saigon Clinic, Vinmec Saigon International Clinic, Family Medical Practice, and Columbia Asia International Hospital - Private Hospital.
